In Psalm 145, King David sings his song of praise. As we reflect on his words, let us join our hearts in minds with him, and with all the saints, as we pray together:

Holy One, as we sit in the silence of our hearts we praise Your name, we seek your face, and ...when we are quiet, we even feel our hearts beating with praise of You. Lord, You are great and worthy of all of our praise and attention.

Yet, as we pause before You now, we realize that our attention is divided and we are far too often drawn away from You by things of this world. We are blown off course by circumstances, stopped in our tracks by fear, and we much too often take the easy way instead of the more challenging way of truth in Christ. Today we looked at some recipe books that offer directions to prepare delicious food. God gave Moses a recipe of specific instructions to have every Israelite family enslaved in Egypt follow a recipe of very specific instructions to worship and honor God by following this instruction very carefully.

The families sacrificed a first born perfect lamb, then followed God's recipe to prepare and eat the food. God also instructed for the blood of the lamb to mark the outside of their home.

Later that night when disaster from God took place against the Egyptians, God saw the lambs' blood and passed over them, causing no destruction to them. This tragic night caused Pharaoh to release the slaves to leave and go with Moses.

The Bible offers direction for God's people to make sound decisions and right thinking with God. The Bible gives a Godly perspective on peer pressure, loneliness, money, friends, family relationships.

Message

"A Fresh Start"

We have remembered together in the past weeks how God called Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, how they were formed into a people, the tribes of Israel, and then saved from famine and grew into a nation. The Israelites had been living in the land of Egypt for generations, and were enslaved and were treated harshly...yet they grew into such a force that they frightened Pharaoh and the Egyptians.

Israel continuously cried out to God for help and salvation.

God heard their cries.

We have studied the birth and call of Moses, as well as how God prepared him to serve in a very specific way. Moses followed God and went into the court of Pharaoh, on behalf of Israel. He called for the people to be released from their bondage. God sent a message through Moses to Pharaoh saying: *Let My people go so that they can freely worship Me*. Pharaoh, of course doesn't want his workforce to leave, and says no – even in the face of terrible plagues.

The water turning to blood...contaminating the drinking water.

Frogs...a nuisance and difficult to kill, but also considered sacred by Egyptians... which left them with a difficult problem.

Lice/gnats...lice are very contagious, which you know if you have had an elementary age child... gnats... are just annoying and get in everything and everywhere

Flies... would have swarmed and killed animals

Livestock pestilence...more death and disruption in the food chain and financially

Boils...painful sores, no cure – and were both on the animals and the Egyptians

Hail/fire...damage to crops, farms, homes and livestock that remained

Locusts...would have eaten the wheat and any grain left further damage to food supply

Darkness for 3 days.

Still, the answer was no.

I wonder what the Israelites were thinking and feeling in the days of the plagues... watching such devastation come to Egypt, but largely being unaffected themselves. I wonder, were they frightened? Did they feel that justice was coming?

Did they truly believe that their time in Egypt had come to an end?

Were they ready to set out on a journey into the unknown - with a God Who would act so severely on their behalf - to set them free...

The scripture text before us today in chapter 12 indicates a clear break in the history of the people. There is the before, the suffering and the difficulties... and there is an after. *This month will be for you the first month of your year*.

This break, of course, would not have changed their experiences or how they had suffered, but it would have given them a sign post and a noticeable fresh start.

A fresh start.

I can't speak for everyone, but my guess is, we are all longing for a fresh start. A new day to dawn.

I read a meme on FB that said, I usually don't stay up to ring in the new year, but THIS year, I am going to stay up and make sure that 2020 leaves.

It's not just that we want to be released from quarantine, that we long for an end to the suffering and difficulties. Because going back to the way things have been for far too long is not enough. We need a new way. A better way to be, to live. A new paradigm. More love. More grace. More light and life.

For Israel the plagues were a sure sign that God was with them, for them, and wanted for them to be free from the bondage of Egypt. Not just free, however, but free to worship Him. With the announcement of the new year, and instructions for how to get ready and BE READY to leave, they must have held onto a real sense of hope for what was to come.

God did not only designate a new year, however... He also gave them instructions... 1. Share with one another. Be connected and work together so that no one carries all of the burden. God said for them to come together in households to pool resources and not waste unnecessarily as they sacrificed a lamb for the Passover meal.

The other day I read an article about a neighborhood sharing app called: buy nothing project. To Buy nothing, give freely, share creatively. I have heard so many people during this time saying that they are cleaning out their closets, and getting rid of their excess. What if we were connected to one another so strongly that we knew who needed those extra items in our drawers... and we could bless them with it! What if we had a system to say, *i am looking for... x y or z...* and we could borrow it from someone who wasn't using it at the time.

The second instruction I want to point out in chapter 12 is that God wanted all of Israel to make it plain Who and Whose they were. They were to put a mark on their doorposts with the blood of the lamb.

I wonder if those we meet, and speak with, outside of the church know by our words and deeds that there is something different about us...that we are marked with the blood of the lamb... Do they see that even in trying circumstances we have hope and joy and life and light...

Q: Are your attitudes and your words indicators of your life in Christ? your belief in a powerful God Who loves you and the world? Do they indicate both who and Whose You are?

I am not saying that we all have to be perfect. but we are to try to be better than we were... we are called to put our trust in God – to recognize our fallenness and get up and try again to pursue God's will above our own in all trials and circumstances. We are called to encourage one another to live into the identity in Christ that is already within us.

And the 3rd item is to be ready to move when God leads. Often in life we get a little too comfortable. A little too cozy or stuck in place...

This scripture indicates that we are to be ready...eat standing up with our shoes on (they normally would have taken them off after entering the house) and dispose of the leftovers so nothing ties you to this place.

Granted, at this point in history we are ALL ready to move. Back into the sanctuary, back into normal life... but Q: are we ready to move in God's directions??

Are we ready to be free... to grab hold of that fresh start... but do so with the leading of Holy Spirit and in the fellowship of God the Father? We must acknowledge God's hand upon us, and lean into His guidance so that when we come out the other side of COVID, when we are finally free... we live fully into the purposes of that freedom in Christ...and not of our own devices.

Fiends, as we come to a close I pray that this time in history will be for us a hallmark of renewal and a fresh start...but not for our sake... for the sake of the Gospel, for the sake of God's work and purposes in this world. And that as we continue in this life we would all be ready to move into the freedom that God desires for us in and with His kingdom.

Amen.

Beloved in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Holy Supper we celebrate today is the joyful feast of God. A time of remembrance, of communion, of hope. Our Lord Jesus invites all who believe in Him to come and be nourished at His table.

Today, His table is set, not in the sanctuary, but in our own homes. Today, we remember both the time Jesus spent with His disciples, and also the remembrance of the Passover which they were celebrating together.

As we come to the table today, please prepare your communion elements. I have today unleavened bread with some herbs baked inside in remembrance of God's commands to the Israelites to eat quickly and be ready to follow Him as they were released from Egypt.

We come remembering that once again we have turned from God's ways and gone our own way. But as we have confessed our sins and been forgiven, and because of God's eternal covenant of grace, we are accepted back into God's presence...into His family.

We come to commune with this same Christ who has promised to be with us always. Christ is the true Bread which nourishes us and the Vine in whom we must live if we are to bear fruit. The Holy Spirit unites us into one body and in communion with all the saints. So we receive this supper in Christ's love and our affection for one another. We come in hope believing that as surely as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we will be raised from the dead into eternal life. This is the Lord's Table. Come, for all is prepared.

Let us pray. The Lord be with you.

And also with you.
Lift up your hearts.
We lift them up to the Lord.
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, almighty and everlasting God. You created the heavens and the earth; you preserve us with your care;

you revealed the fullness of your love for us by sending Jesus Christ. By his life, death, and resurrection you have reconciled us to yourself. With the heavenly host and with the saints of all times and places, we lift up our hearts in joyful praise, saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

Gracious God, send your Holy Spirit upon us, we pray that the bread which we break and the cup which we bless may be to us the communion of the body and blood of Christ. Accept the gift of our lives that we may live in you and serve your kingdom. Being joined together in Christ, may your whole church be one; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. Even so, come, Lord Jesus. Amen.

On the night of his arrest, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread and after giving thanks to God he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, Take, Eat, this is my body broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

And in the same way he took the cup saying: this cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.

Whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup you proclaim the saving death of the risen Lord until he comes.
